CODE OF CONDUCT



ATTENDANCE CRITERIA

To be eligible to attend Utah DECA sponsored events, and National DECA events, students must be a registered and paid member of DECA.

DECA Inc Board of Directors has specified that there be a minimum of one adult advisor for every eight high school DECA members for overnight trips. For one-day conferences and events, Utah DECA will follow the policy set by each district for the number of advisors needed per student attendees. Advisors/chaperones must register for the conference, pay the registration fee, and be in attendance the entire period of the conference. There are no restrictions on the number of adult advisors who may attend.

DECA MEMBER CONDUCT

I agree to the following rules and policies:

- 1. There shall be no defacing of public property. Any damages to any property or furnishings in buildings must be paid by the individual or chapter responsible.
- 2. Advisors will be kept informed of student activities and whereabouts at all times.
- 3. Participants must wear identification badges at all times.
- 4. Participants shall refrain from using inappropriate or profane language at all times.
- 5. Delegates shall refrain from written, verbal, physical or electronic activities that may lead to harassment, hazing, bulling or damaging property.
- 6. The use of any harassment against anyone on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, age, gender, sexual orientation or disability is prohibited.
- 7. Participants shall respect the rights and safety of other guests.
- 8. Participants shall be in their assigned rooms and quiet at curfew. Curfew times are not subject to debate and must be strictly adhered to. Students who are aware of other students who have violated curfew must report those students to their chapter advisor. Failure to report is considered a violation of curfew.
- 9. No alcoholic beverages, tobacco, narcotics or weapons in any form shall be possessed by participants at any time, under any circumstances.
- 10. Participants shall be prompt and prepared for all activities.
- 11. Participants are required to attend all general sessions and assigned activities.
- 12. The dress code noted in the conference registration materials will be in effect at all times.
- 13. Casual wear will be acceptable during social functions and at designated times during the conference.

- 14. Participants are not allowed to enter hotel rooms of the opposite gender.
- 15. Curfew will be enforced. Curfew means that the participant is in he/his assigned rooms.
- 16. Chapters will be responsible for participants' conduct.
- 17. Disrespect to any school, state, or conference/hotel official will not be tolerated. Disrespect will be grounds for immediate removal from the conference.
- 18. Participants ignoring or violating any of the above rules will be subject to disqualification and may be sent home immediately at participant's expense.
